

Dress code for Coosaw Creek Country Club

The standards of the dress code are important to the club and have been established to compliment the overall experience of the club for all members. Club management and staff reserve the right to determine when attire does not meet the dress code and may refuse entrance or services to members and their guests. Members are responsible to inform their guests of the dress code and ensuring that their guests are in compliance with all club policies.

Dress Code For Dining Room, lounge and special events:

Shorts and quality denim is allowed in the clubhouse as long as there are no torn, frayed or rips.

Men are required to wear a collared shirt. No hats allowed in the dining room. Hats are allowed in the lounge area ONLY. No t-shirts, bathing suits, sweatpants, hoodies, athletic wear (including tank tops, athletic pants and athletic shorts). No household slippers.

Allowed for women are dresses, skirts, slacks, golf shorts and blouses. No t-shirts, bathing suits, fishnet tops, sweatpants, athletic wear (including tank tops, athletic pants, athletic shorts, leggings). Leggings are allowed if worn under a skirt/skort or shorts. No household slippers.

Dress Code For Coosaw Creek Golfers:

Men must wear shirts with collars and sleeves. Mock turtleneck shirts are allowed. Shirts are preferred to be tucked in whenever possible.

Slacks or golf shorts only. Golf shorts up to four inches above the knee.

No denim, t-shirts, cut-offs, bathing suits, sweatpants, athletic wear (including tank tops, athletic pants and shorts).

Appropriate golf shoes with soft spikes only are required on the golf course and practice facilities.

Women must wear shirts with a collar or mock collar including sleeveless shirts. Appropriate attire includes Golf dresses, skirts/skorts, slacks or shorts. Golf Skirts/skorts and golf shorts with a minimum of a four-inch inseam. Leggings ONLY if they are under a skirt, skort or shorts. No denim, t-shirts, cut-offs, bathing suits, sweatpants, athletic wear (including tank tops, athletic pants and shorts).

Appropriate golf shoes with soft spikes only are required on the golf course and practice facilities.

NEW PROSHOP HOURS OF OPERATION

Starting Sunday, March 10th! Tuesday through Sunday 7 am - 7 pm The first tee time is at 7:30 am Tuesday – Friday and 7 am on the weekends and holidays. The Practice Range closes at 5 pm on Thursday and Sunday evenings to allow for proper maintenance.

Starting Monday, March 11th, the golf course AND practice facilities will be closed on Mondays until 3:00 pm for the remainder of the year. We will open for Major Monday holidays such as Memorial Day and Labor Day and also for Private Monday Outings held several times throughout the year.

Please NOTE: The flags will be pulled on Mondays, meaning the golf course is **CLOSED**. Pins will go back in at 3:00 pm and the course is available for WALKING ONLY. The Pro-shop itself will be closed on Mondays with no outdoor services. The Driving range will remain closed for the entire day.

This important closure time will allow Jamie and team to properly perform important uninterrupted maintenance on the golf course and practice facilities. Some of these projects will include performing proper spray applications, wetland and pond bank trimming, Verti cutting on putting surfaces, proper angle cuts on fairways, performing much needed work to collars and greens edges, apply proper topdressing and brushing practices so that the sand has time to dry before brushing.

Our golf course is one of our greatest assets and this time is needed to properly maintain it and allow our team to improve on the quality of the finished product.

Pace of Play and Dress Code policy

All Coosaw Creek Golf Club members and guests are expected to respect and adhere to the Club's dress codes for all club venues. Appropriate golf attire is required on the golf course, driving range, and all practice areas.

On the Golf Course and Practice Areas:

MEN:

- Shirts with collars and sleeves
- Mock turtleneck shirts
 - o Shirts are preferred to be tucked whenever possible
- Slacks and golf shorts
 - o Golf shorts up to four inches above the knee

WOMEN:

- Golf shirts (sleeveless shirts must have a collar/mock collar)
- Golf dresses, skirts/skorts, slacks, and golf shorts
 - o Golf skirts/skorts and golf shorts with a minimum of a four-inch inseam
- Leggings ONLY if they are under a skirt, skorts, or shorts

Attire that is NOT permitted:

MEN:

- Denim/Jeans
- Tank tops, T-shirts, Fishnet tops (Jerseys)
- Swim/Bathing suits
- Cut-offs
- Sweatpants, athletic workout wear (including athletic pants and athletic shorts)

WOMEN:

- Denim/Jeans
- Tank tops, T-shirts, Fishnet tops (Jerseys), mid-drift tops
- Swim/Bathing suits
- Cut-offs
- Sweatpants, athletic workout wear (including athletic pants and athletic shorts)
- Leggings (unless worn under a skirt, skort, or shorts

SHOES:

- Soft spike golf shoes, golf sandals, or flat-soled tennis/golf shoes are required.
- Hard spike golf shoes and beach flip-flops are not permitted.

*If the attire is not appropriate, you may purchase appropriate attire at the Pro Shop or be asked to leave the golf course property. The Pro-Shop and club management personnel are available to answer any questions.

PACE OF PLAY

- It is the responsibility of each playing group to keep up with the group in front of them.
 - No group should fall more than one hole behind the group in front of them.
- Anticipate the club or clubs you may need to complete your shot.
- Go directly to your ball and be prepared to hit.
- The 40 second clock begins once it is the players turn to hit their shot.
- Play ready golf when appropriate.
- Limit your search for lost balls to 3 minutes.
- Begin lining up your putt while the other players are putting.
- Record your score when you arrive at the next tee box.
- If you cannot retain your pace of play during your round, allow the players behind you to play through.



COURSE NEWS

by Jamie Newton, Superintendent

Our Seasonal workers have arrived as many of you have probably noticed. First order of business was to start on course bed work. This entails cleaning of the beds, trimming all plants and adding mulch and Pinestraw. This is about a 4 week process all said and done. We have also started adding sand to bunkers to help with consistency hole to hole, this is also a time consuming process so please bear with us. At the time of this publication we are about 50 % complete on the bunker sand additions.



On March 27th we will be applying a bulk application of fertilizer to the entire course, this application will help kick start the Bermuda out of dormancy which will allow for a quicker green-up once soil temperatures rise. We will be spreading a 38-0-0 analysis along with a pre emergent granular to help with spring weed germination. This will certainly help all of the high traffic thinning areas we have developed this winter from the poor weather.

Just as a quick reminder, when we are cart path only it's very important to keep all 4 tires on the path, when we have puddles on the path please do not drive around puddles into the soaked turf. This causes unsightly damage to the edges that we will have to look at until we get good growing weather. Please also remember to fix your ball marks and fill your divots, maintenance thanks you in advance for this!

Coosaw Creek Pace of Play and Visage GPS System

Time is one of the most valuable things in the world we live in today, with demands from work, family and extracurricular activities. For this reason, pace of play is a priority at Coosaw Creek. Our Pace of Play expectation is to complete an 18 hole round of golf within 4 hours and 12 minutes. The goal of this time expectation is to ensure an enjoyable round experience for all of our members and guests. On busy days, it can be challenging to complete all rounds within this expected time frame. And, if one group on the course is slow, every group playing behind this one group will also be delayed.

Our golf cars are equipped with Visage Touch Screen GPS systems to provide golfers with helpful course information such as location of hazards and distance to greens and obstacles, as well as monitor the pace of

play of each group. Once a group falls 1 minute behind the pace setting, a pace warning will appear on the screen in yellow and will remain visible until the group regains the proper pace. And, if a group falls more than 9 minutes behind the pace setting, a pace warning will appear on the screen in red. These warnings will also be followed by a message(s) informing the group that it is behind pace. Once a group is behind pace, our golf staff may provide special instructions for that group. These special instructions may include a request to: speed up play, allow a group(s) to play through or skip a hole(s) to regain the proper position on the course. Again, our goal is to provide an enjoyable experience for all of our members and guests. So, help us by keeping your group moving on pace!

Below are helpful hints for pace of play from the USGA:

Position of Bags or Carts

When players are approaching the green, golf bags or carts should be positioned to allow for quick and efficient movement off the green towards the next tee.

Marking Score Cards

While it is strongly recommended that players remain at the green to watch the other players in their group hole out, the marking of score cards should not be done at the green if this may delay play of the group behind. Mark score cards on the way to or at the next tee. That said, the player who is first to play from the next tee should play first and then mark the card.

Playing a Provisional Ball

Ball searches and lost balls are a feature of golf, but they do cause delay. However, the delay can be significantly minimized if the player whose ball might be in danger of being lost or OB has played a provisional ball.

Watching the Flight of the Ball Carefully

The problem of lost balls can be significantly reduced if all players in a group make a conscious effort to watch each other's shots and their own shots as carefully and as often as possible. This will result in less searching time and fewer lost balls.

'Ready Golf'

Playing "ready golf" is permissible in stroke play and can improve pace of play. "Ready Golf" means playing when you are ready to hit, regardless of who is away (just make sure that it is safe to play when hitting).

Choosing an appropriate time & tee to play

If golfers want to play quickly, they should attempt to get one of the first starting times of the day and set the pace or choose a quieter time of the day when the course may be under-utilized. Selecting a tee for play that is appropriate to playing ability will also help speed up play and provide a more enjoyable overall experience.



t the February 20 meeting, forty-two garden club members listened attentively to Kathy ■ Woolsey share her expertise on 'Caring for Roses'. Kathy is a former President of the Charleston

Lowcountry Rose Society and has an extensive background as a horticulturist and landscaper.

Since growing roses in the south can be a challenge with high humidity and high temperatures that can last for months, Kathy began by acquainting us with some of the many types of roses that can withstand the heat and humidity. She recommends Polyanthus, Noisette, Hybrid Musk, China Rose, and Tea Roses (not to be confused with Hybrid Teas Roses).

Kathy discussed other topics such as pruning and feeding roses. Pruning is an important part of rose care as it promotes growth and prevents disease by opening up the plant to good air circulation. When and how to prune depends on the variety. See Clemson HGIC 1173.

For gardeners looking to improve their soil, adding organic matter is an essential part of the process. Kathy stated, "Organic matter will fix any soil problem". Organic matter is a general term for any material that was once alive, such as compost, manure, and mulch.

Kathy ended her presentation with a Q&A session answering many questions with helpful tips and expert advice on caring and growing beautiful roses in our own landscapes and rose gardens. Although the

FACILITY USE

The Coosaw Creek Country Club amenities include the Swimming Pool and Pavilion, Tennis Courts, Basketball Court, Golf Course and Clubhouse. We encourage all of our members to take advantage of the various fun activities and facilities available to them. To assure a safe and enjoyable experience for all it is important to note the following guidelines:

18 HOLE PAR 71 ARTHUR HILLS CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSE - Winds through beautiful low country wooded wetlands surrounded by community homes. Golf Pro Shop hours are 7AM-7PM everyday.

During golf play hours of 7AM to dusk only Pro Shop authorized golfers and the Club maintenance staff are allowed on the course and cart paths.

Personal golf carts, skate boards or other personal motorized vehicles are not permitted on the course or cart paths at anytime.

Golfers are expected to dress appropriately. Men must wear collared shirts (sorry-no denim allowed on the Golf Course). For women shirts without collars must have sleeves, and shirts without sleeves must have collars. Soft spikes are required.

Dog walkers, permitted before or after golf hours, must carry and use pooper scoopers and keep pets off of tees, fairways, greens and bunkers.

Any unapproved play, practice or abuse observed on the course may result in suspension of Club privileges and/or fines.

GOLF PRACTICE FACILITY – The Practice Areas are open during normal Golf Course hours except for posted regularly scheduled maintenance times. Practice areas include the Driving Range, Chipping Green, Practice Sand Bunker, Putting Green and teaching area.

Teaching is provided exclusively by the Coosaw Creek Professional Golf Staff.

All practice must be approved by the Pro Shop staff.

Practice balls may be picked up (Members) or purchased in the Pro Shop.

Range balls and bags are the property of Coosaw Creek Country Club and shall not be removed from club property. Proper Attire is the same as for the Golf Course. COOSAW CREEK COUNTRY CLUB Clubhouse is Coosaw Creek's community center featuring full service dining, Bar, Meeting Rooms and Pro Shop. In addition to supporting the many social functions of the Members, the Clubhouse banquet facilities are available to Members or meetings, parties, weddings and other celebrations. Take-out and call ahead service is also available.

Quality denim or golf shorts are allowed in the clubhouse unless specified otherwise for special events. For all evening dining events after 5pm, men must wear a collared shirt and caps are not allowed in the dining room. Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times. Cover ups must be worn over Swim attire.

TENNIS AND BASKETBALL COURTS

Two regulation Plexipave lighted tennis courts and a basketball court are available to Members only:

Tennis courts are strictly reserved for tennis.

Tennis play is on a first come, first served basis until 11:00pm

Appropriate apparel and regulation tennis shoes are required for play on the tennis courts.

Shirts must be worn at all times on the Basketball Court which is a multi function surface that can be used for any suitable purpose.

The Basketball Court is available on a first come first served basis.

All instructions from pool staff and/or lifeguards must be obeyed.

All Food or Beverages must be purchased from the Club, unless prior approval has been obtained from the General Manager.

Pool closes at 9:00 PM except for special events.

PLAYGROUND

A mulch filled area equipped with swings, slides and other playground equipment is available and located next to the Pool Pavilion -For safety any child under 9 years old must be supervised by an adult.

Playground closes at 9:00 PM

PONDS

Coosaw Creek's beautiful ponds have been stocked with fish - but BEWARE of snakes, alligators and other wildlife.




